Dear Members of the Winthrop Town Council,

As a resident and practicing attorney in Winthrop, with extended family in the town going back 3 generations, I am writing to urge you to **place the recall question on the November ballot.**

Thousands of residents signed the petition **in good faith and within the required timeframe**, following the exact process outlined in the Town Charter. The **Board of Registrars has confirmed** the validity of these signatures and affirmed our right to vote on this matter.

To block the recall from reaching the ballot at this stage would **undermine public trust, disenfranchise voters**, and send a troubling message that the will of the people can be ignored, even when every step of the Charter's process has been met.

Please **do the right thing**: vote to place the recall question on the ballot and **allow the voters to decide at the polls**, as our local democratic process intends.
